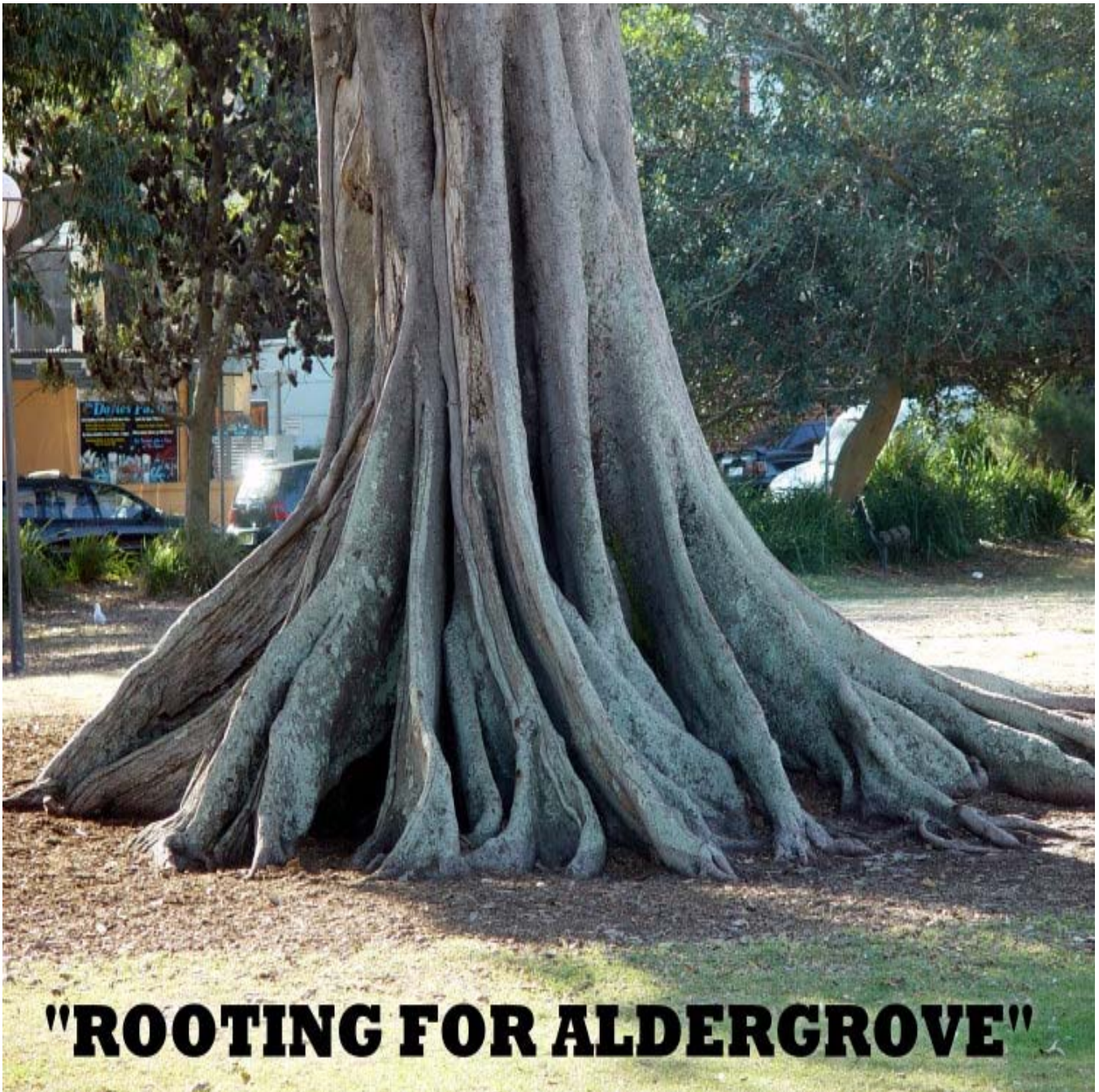

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

NOTE: There are no entry fees for any class. All prizes are ribbons only, unless otherwise stated. Entry forms must be received by July 20th, 2010.

1. Exhibitors may enter only ONE entry per class number.
2. Entry forms may be mailed to Box 1053, Aldergrove, B.C., V4W 2V1, emailed to aldergrovefairdays@gmail.com, or faxed to 604-857-8964. Entries can also be dropped off at the Aldergrove Star office, 27118 Fraser Highway.
3. **Entry forms** must be received by **July 20th, 2010** to allow for processing of your entries. As such, late entries can not be accepted.
4. **All entries** are to be brought to the **Kinsmen Community Centre** (see map on back of book) on Friday, July 23rd, 2010 between 2:00 and 6:00 PM. In certain cases, alternate times may be arranged by contacting us at 604-512-4116 or by email at aldergrovefairdays@gmail.com.
5. **All entries must have been grown by or be the work of the Exhibitor and are not eligible if they have been shown at a previous Aldergrove Fall Fair or Aldergrove Fair Days.**
6. Ribbons will be awarded for first, second and third place in each class, if the entries merit such recognition. The judge is not required to award ribbons for an article not worthy of a ribbon. The judging is based on the quality of the work, rather than number of entries per class. If the judge wishes, they may award more than one first, second, or third place in a class if the entries warrant it.
7. Prize ribbons awarded by the judges will be displayed on the entries for the entire Fair.
8. The Association is not responsible for any entries that are damaged, lost, or stolen during the Fair. Please leave valuable and irreplaceable items at home.
9. Entries **MUST** not be removed before 5:00PM on Sunday, July 25th, 2010. Exhibitors must check-in prior to removing their entries.
10. All entries **MUST** be picked up at between 5:00 PM and 6:00 PM on Sunday, July 25th, 2010. If you are unable to have your entries picked up during this time, please contact us at 604-512-4116 or by email at aldergrovefairdays@gmail.com.
11. Any articles left after 6:00PM on Sunday, July 25th, 2010 will be donated to charity.
12. The Association reserves the right to reject or disqualify any entry that is objectionable or offensive in any way.

Section S1 - Featured Classes "Techniques That Never Grow Old"

Class #:

1. Smocking is a technique that never grows old. This old fashioned needle art has never really gone out of style. Whether it be a home decor item such as a smocked pillow, a decorative piece such as a smocked Christmas ornament, or an item of clothing, we want you to share this unique style of embroidery in whatever project you choose.
2. Do you whittle? Whittle.... today we know it as carving. Show us your hand carved item that you have whittled from a piece of wood. (No lathe work) Your unique creation using any type of wood must be no larger than 24" x 24" x 24".
3. There is an old saying "A picture is worth a thousand words", and we are looking for a colour picture that depicts agriculture in our province. Your Agriculture Picture is to be unframed and mounted on a firm backing, maximum size of photo and backing not to exceed 8" x 10". *(The entry voted top choice by the delegates at the 2010 Convention will be printed on the December LiveWire cover and posted on the BC Fairs website. Please provide location/region where the photo was taken on back of the entry).*

BAKING & CANNING**
Open to ages 19 and over

Entry Form: Adult form

Special Rules:

1. **All entries** must have an attached label identifying the entry (ie Blueberry muffins, Canned pears)
2. **Cakes** - Remove from pan & placed on a firm base. A piece of heavy duty cardboard cut to size & covered with foil makes a good base. Cover with a clear plastic dome (preferred) or a Ziploc-type bag.
3. **Pies** - Exhibit in a 9" metal or foil pie plate, and cover with a Ziploc-type bag.
4. **All other baked goods** are to be placed on a disposable plate/tray of appropriate size & covered with a Ziploc-type bag. If you are entering an item with a soft or sticky topping, please cover with a clear plastic dome.
5. **Store bought mixes & fillings** are not permitted.
6. Entries requiring refrigeration can NOT be accepted.
7. **All canned goods** must be sealed in standard canning jars with new rings & lids. Rings must be loose, but seals not broken.
8. Please do not top canning jars with decorative covers.

Entry Form: Adult form**Special Rules:**

1. All wine entries must have a 3" x 1" label attached to the wine bottle stating the type of wine, the name of the berry, fruit, grape or concentrate from which it was made, and the sweetness (dry, medium, or sweet).
2. In classes where there are different sweetness categories, exhibitors may enter one wine of each sweetness.
3. All wines must be exhibited in standard wine bottles.
4. All beer entries to be exhibited in standard beer bottles.
5. Beer bottles closures may be either plastic screw-on caps or metal bottle caps.
6. All wine & beer entries must have been made by the Exhibitor at their place of residence by the process of fermentation, excluding u-brew entries.
7. U-Brew wine & beer may only be entered in section B4.

Open to all ages

Eggs must be from chickens that are being raised by the exhibitor.

Open to ages 19 and over

Entry Form: Adult form**NOTE:** One vegetable or fruit from each entry may be cut into to determine its inside quality.



How to Prepare Your Entries

Vegetables should be clean, but not scrubbed.

Beans - trim stems to ½"

Beets - trim tops to 1"; leave roots intact.

Carrots - trim tops to ½"; leave roots intact

Corn - remove one third of husk, lengthwise; trim shanks to ½"

Kale - remove roots

Kohlrabi - trim roots and leaf stems close to the bulb

Leeks - shorten roots to ½"; trim tops

Lettuce - remove roots & small or damaged outside leaves

Onions - trim roots & tops to ½"; remove only dirty outer scales; do not wash

Peppers - leave stems on

Potatoes - brush off dry soil, do not wash

Radishes - Should be bunched with tops and roots left intact.

Swiss Chard - remove roots

Tomatoes - leave stems on

Cut herbs - Tie in a neat bunch of 5 sprigs/blades & display in water. Please use a clear jar/bottle & attach a clearly printed label naming herb.

Tree fruits - Leave stems on.

Apples, crabapples & pears should be wiped, but not polished. Stone fruit should not be wiped.

Berries - Exhibit brambles (blackberries, loganberries, etc.) & raspberries with hulls removed. Exhibit all other berries with hulls or stems attached. Do not polish entries.

Rhubarb - Trim leaves to 1" in a fan shape & leave base intact.

JUDGING CRITERIA

Fruit & vegetable entries will be judged on:

- **Size** - specimens should be of good average size for the variety
- **Colour** - specimens should be bright, clear and attractive
- **Uniformity** - specimens should be as uniform as possible in colour, maturity, shape and size
- **Appearance** - specimens should be free of pests, blemishes, diseases, dirt, & damage

FLOWERS & PLANTS

NOTE: All plant entries must be owned by the Exhibitor for at least 1 month prior to the Fair.

DEFINITIONS

Annual - a plant that grows, blooms, seeds and dies in one year, and is reproduced from seeds

Perennial - a plant that lives for more than two years growing from the same root, bulb or tuber each year, wintering either in or out of the ground

Bloom - a single flower on a stem

Cut - a branch with leaves, flowers & buds or blossoms

Foliage - the leaves of any plant, or stems bearing only leaves

Spike - a thick upright stem carrying several blooms

Spray - branch, bearing dependent branchlets or flowers

Stem - only the stem the blossoms are on, no leaves or side shoots

Succulent - A plant with very fleshy leaves or stems or both

How to prepare flower entries:

- Display in a container of appropriate size for the entry. Please do not use valuable or irreplaceable containers, as breakage is possible & the Fair cannot be held responsible.
- Uniformity is very important. Try to select blooms of the same colour & size.

JUDGING CRITERIA

Cut flowers will be judged on:

- **Form** - uniformity, proper shape, and proper petalage
- **Stem & Foliage** - strength and/or straightness, quality, size and proportion
- **Colour** - uniformity, intensity, clarity and brilliance
- **Size** - uniformity and proper size for variety
- **Condition** - free of blemish, pests, disease and damage

Plants will be judged on:

- **Foliage** - clean, healthy, of good colour
- **Condition** - old foliage or blooms removed; free of blemish, pests, disease and damage
- **Size** - plant and pot size of proper proportion
- **Appearance** - in clean, attractive pot

6. Asters, double flowered - 3 blooms, 1 kind
7. Zinnia - 5 blooms, 1 kind
8. Marigold - 5 blooms, 1 kind
9. Chrysanthemum - 3 blooms, 1 kind
10. Strawflowers - 3 blooms, 1 kind
11. Snapdragons - 3 spikes, 1 colour, 1 kind
12. Dianthus - 3 blooms, 1 colour, 1 kind
13. Carnations - 3 blooms, 1 colour, 1 kind
14. Cut flowers, not listed above - 3 blooms, 1 kind

1. Yellow Peace Rose - 1 bloom

Section D7 - House Plants**Class #:**

1. African violet - 1 plant
2. Fern - 1 plant
3. Cactus or succulent - 1 plant
4. Cactus and/or succulent collection - a garden in a dish
5. Any other flowering houseplant
6. Any other foliage houseplant

**Section D8 - Container Grown Outdoor Plants****Class #:**

1. Begonia - 1 plant
2. Fuchsia - 1 plant
3. Geranium - 1 plant
4. Petunia - 1 plant
5. Impatiens - 1 plant
6. Mixed container or/basket, containing 3 or more varieties of plants



The **May Hamre Trophy** is awarded to the **needlework exhibitor** with the highest aggregate score, with a first place counted as 3 points, a second

place as 2 points, and a third place as 1 point.

This trophy was presented by May's family to recognize her many years of work in the needlework section of the Fair.

Division F - NEEDLEWORK

Open to ages 19 and over

Entry Form: Adult form**Needlework Rules:**

1. Items must be finished, clean, in pristine condition, unused & unworn.
2. Please read class descriptions carefully. A dress is a dress and **not** a "dress & bonnet". If in doubt about any class, please phone for clarification.
3. Embroidered pictures must be framed or mounted & wired for hanging. Please ensure that wire is securely fastened & able to support picture's weight.
4. Doilies should be mounted on firm cardboard for display.
5. Doll clothes may be mounted, or displayed on a doll. Please do not use valuable dolls, as breakage is possible & Fair cannot be held responsible.
6. If work bears a signature, it must be covered or removed for judging.
7. Remember that we will take good care of all items, but please leave items which require special care at home where they are safe.
8. Hand knitting is required unless specifically stated otherwise.
9. A class listed "as any other article" is for items for which there is not a specific class.
10. A class may be divided if entries warrant it.

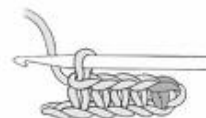

4. Any article using serging for all, or almost all, construction

1. Dropped yoke dress, sizes 0-14 years

- All entries must be the original work of the exhibitor, NOT copies of work by other artists.
- All pictures must not exceed 26" x26" including the frame.
- ALL pictures MUST be securely wired and ready for hanging. Pictures that can not be hung will not be judged.

Division H - PHOTOGRAPHY
Open to ages 19 and over

Entry form: Adult form

All photography classes are open to both digital & 35 mm photography.

- Prizes will be awarded for top points in each section - Novice and Advanced.
- Once a competitor has won top points in the Novice Division, they must compete in the Advanced section in following years.



Photography Guidelines

- Each person may enter only one item per class.
- Photos to be mounted on black paper with a 1" border. Attach a label to back of each entry listing exhibitor's name, category, section, and item #.
- All prints to be no smaller than 4"x6" and no larger than 8"x12". Picture story photos to be either 4"x6" or 5"x7" & must be mounted together on black paper with a maximum 1" border around display.
- Panoramic photos are only permitted in Section H2 - 5.

Photographs will be judged on:

- Technique used appropriate for the subject matter
- Centre of interest with a unified effect throughout
- Shadows & light used effectively
