NOTE: There are no entry fees for any class. All prizes are ribbons only, unless otherwise stated. Entry forms must be received by July 7th, 2011.

1. Exhibitors may enter only ONE entry per class number.

3. **Entry forms** must be received by **July 7th, 2011** to allow for processing of your entries. As such, late entries can not be accepted.
4. **All exhibits** are to be brought to the **Kinsmen Community Centre** on Friday, July 22nd, 2011 between 2:00 and 6:00 PM. In certain cases, alternate times may be arranged by contacting us at 604-512-4116 or by email at aldergrovefairdays@gmail.com.
5. **All entries must have been grown by or be the work of the Exhibitor and are not eligible if they have been shown at a previous Aldergrove Fall Fair or Aldergrove Fair Days.**
6. Ribbons will be awarded for first, second and third place in each class, if the entries merit such recognition. The judge is not required to award ribbons for an article not worthy of a ribbon. The judging is based on the quality of the work, rather than number of entries per class. If the judge wishes, they may award more than one first, second, or third place in a class if the entries warrant it.
7. Prize ribbons awarded by the judges will be displayed on the entries for the entire Fair.
8. The Association is not responsible for any entries that are damaged, lost, or stolen during the Fair. Please leave valuable and irreplaceable items at home.
9. Entries **MUST** not be removed before 4:00PM on Sunday, July 24th, 2011. Exhibitors must check-in prior to removing their entries.
10. All entries **MUST** be picked up at between 4:00 PM and 5:00 PM on Sunday, July 24th, 2011. If you are unable to have your entries picked up during this time, please contact us at 604-512-4116 or by email at aldergrovefairdays@gmail.com.
11. Any articles left after 5:00PM on Sunday, July 24th, 2011 will be donated to charity.
12. The Association reserves the right to reject or disqualify any entry that is objectionable or offensive in any way.

1. QUILT BLOCK - Open to ALL ages. (Use the Adult entry form - Green)

Theme of the quilt block must be agriculture, i.e. roosters, cows, barns, fruit, vegetables, tractors, etc

Block must be a minimum 12" x 12" to a maximum of 24" x 24". Must be hand quilted, not framed and no embellishments, i.e.; buttons, appliqués, etc.

2. COLOUR PHOTOGRAPHY - Open to YOUTH (ages 17 years and under)
Use the Youth entry form - Yellow

Theme of the photograph must be Agriculture farm buildings and/or farm equipment. Photograph must be 8" x 10" (not to be digitally altered beyond the standard optimization) and must be mounted on a firm backing with ½ inch to 1-inch black mat border. Frames or glass will NOT be accepted. NO UNMOUNTED PHOTOGRAPHS WILL BE ACCEPTED.

4-H EVENTS

2. In classes where there are different sweetness categories, exhibitors may enter one wine of each sweetness.
3. All wines must be exhibited in standard wine bottles. All beer entries to be exhibited in standard beer bottles. Beer bottles closures may be either plastic screw-on caps or metal bottle caps.
4. All wine & beer entries must have been made by the Exhibitor at their place of residence by the process of fermentation, excluding u-brew entries.
5. U-Brew wine & beer may only be entered in section B4.

NOTE: One vegetable or fruit from each entry may be cut into to determine its inside quality.

How to Prepare Your Entries

Vegetables should be clean, but not scrubbed.

Beans - trim stems to ½"

Beets - trim tops to 1"; leave roots intact.

Carrots - trim tops to ½"; leave roots intact

Corn - remove one third of husk, lengthwise; trim shanks to ½"

Kale - remove roots

Kohlrabi - trim roots and leaf stems close to the bulb

Leeks - shorten roots to ½"; trim tops

Lettuce - remove roots & small or damaged outside leaves

Onions - trim roots & tops to ½"; remove only

dirty outer scales; do not wash

Peppers - leave stems on

Potatoes - brush off dry soil, do not wash

Radishes - Should be bunched with tops and roots left intact.

Swiss Chard - remove roots

Tomatoes - leave stems on

Cut herbs - Tie in a neat bunch of 5 sprigs/blades & display in water. Please use a clear jar/bottle & attach a clearly printed label naming herb.

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FLOWERS & PLANTS

NOTE: All plant entries must be owned by the Exhibitor for at least 1 month prior to the Fair.

DEFINITIONS

Annual - a plant that grows, blooms, seeds and dies in one year, and is reproduced from seeds

Perennial - a plant that lives for more than two years growing from the same root, bulb or tuber each year, wintering either in or out of the ground

Bloom - a single flower on a stem

Cut - a branch with leaves, flowers & buds or blossoms

Foliage - the leaves of any plant, or stems bearing only leaves

Spike - a thick upright stem carrying several blooms

Spray - branch, bearing dependent branchlets or flowers

Stem - only the stem the blossoms are on, no leaves or side shoots

Succulent - A plant with very fleshy leaves or stems or both

How to prepare flower entries:

- Display in a container of appropriate size for the entry. Please do not use valuable or irreplaceable containers, as breakage is possible & the Fair cannot be held responsible.
- Uniformity is very important. Try to select blooms of the same colour & size.

JUDGING CRITERIA

Cut flowers will be judged on:

- **Form** - uniformity, proper shape, and proper petalage
- **Stem & Foliage** - strength and/or straightness, quality, size and proportion
- **Colour** - uniformity, intensity, clarity and brilliance
- **Size** - uniformity and proper size for variety
- **Condition** - free of blemish, pests, disease and damage

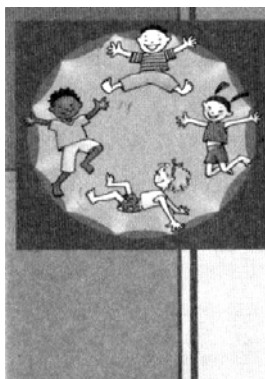
Plants will be judged on:

- **Foliage** - clean, healthy, of good colour
- **Condition** - old foliage or blooms removed; free of blemish, pests, disease and damage
- **Size** - plant and pot size of proper proportion
- **Appearance** - in clean, attractive pot

2. **Elegance** - Beauty and tasteful design is the focus. Not to exceed 28" in depth and height.
3. **Modern Space** - A contemporary design, not to exceed 24" in depth and width.
4. **Miniature Masterpiece** - A little beauty, not to exceed 6" in width, depth and height.
5. **Center of Attention** - A table centerpiece, holiday themes welcome, not to exceed 24" in width, depth and height.
6. **Fragrant Bouquet** - Must use all natural dried and live cut flowers or herbs, not to exceed 24" in width and depth.
7. **Rustic Relic** - Focus on farm and history. Use an old boot, milk can, etc and design an arrangement.

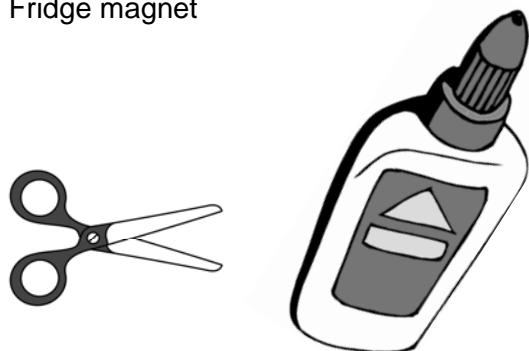
